Request to be a Consulting Party

Dear Mr. Wongan,

The City of Logan in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) propose roadway and intersection improvements along 200 East between 300 South and 1400 North in Logan. Please see the enclosed maps for orientation. The purpose of the project is to address safety and maintenance concerns along the roadway. The improvements will consist of adding turn lanes at priority intersections, pavement replacement, signal improvements, and widening the roadway where necessary. The length of the project corridor is approximately 2.3 miles. Construction activities are anticipated to occur within the existing right-of-way.

In accordance with the regulations published by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, 36 CFR Part 800, FHWA requests that you review this information to determine if there are any historic properties of traditional religious and/or cultural importance that may be affected by this undertaking. If you feel that there are any historic properties that may be impacted, we request your notification as such and your participation as a consulting party during the development of the environmental document.

At your request, FHWA and UDOT staff will be available to meet with you to discuss any concerns you might have. If there is any question about the area, we will be happy to send a copy of the cultural resources inventory report and any site forms at your request. Please be assured that we will maintain strict confidentiality about certain types of information regarding traditional religious and/or cultural historic properties that might be affected by this proposed undertaking. We would also appreciate any suggestions you might have about any other groups or individuals that we should contact regarding this project.

A response within 30 days would be appreciated should you have concerns about this project and/or wish to be a consulting party. Please feel free to contact me at 801-963-0078, ex. 235, to answer any questions or provide any additional information.

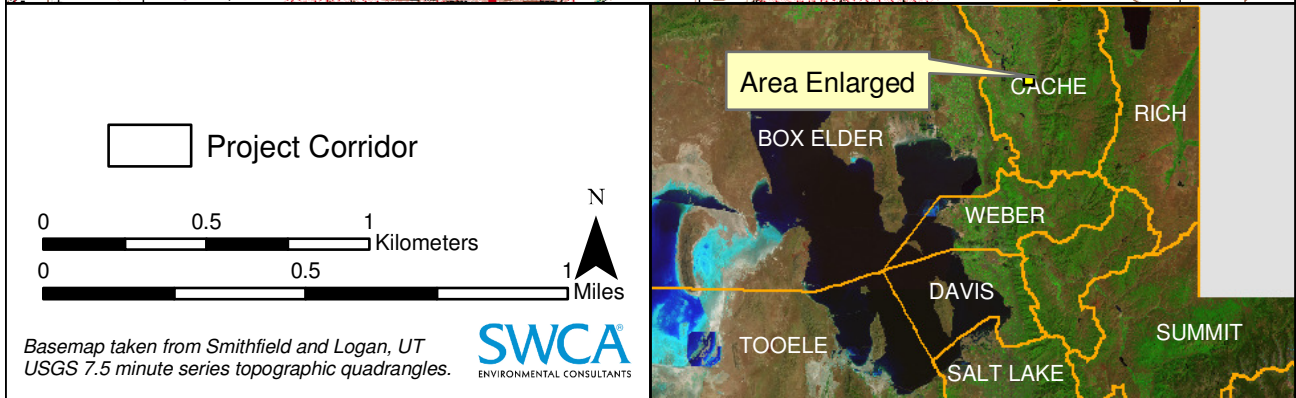

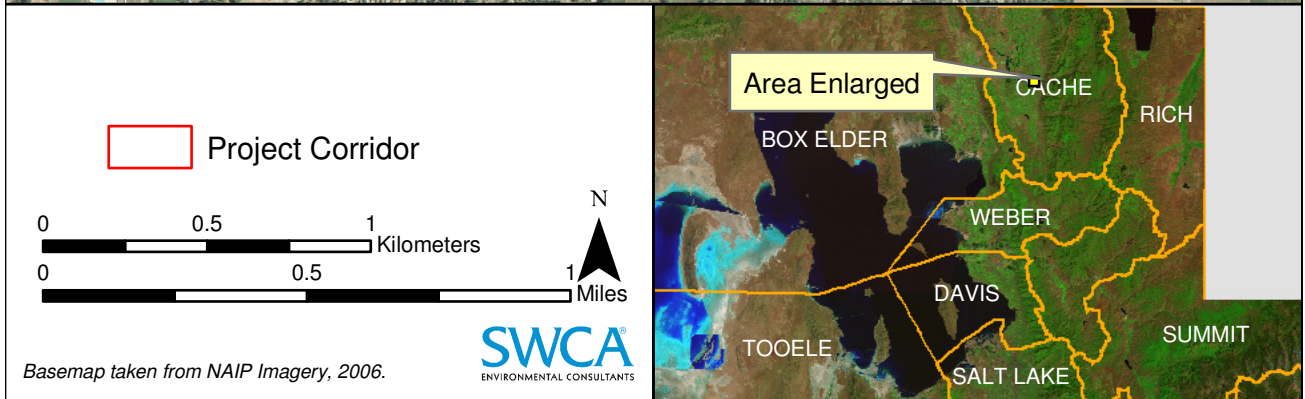
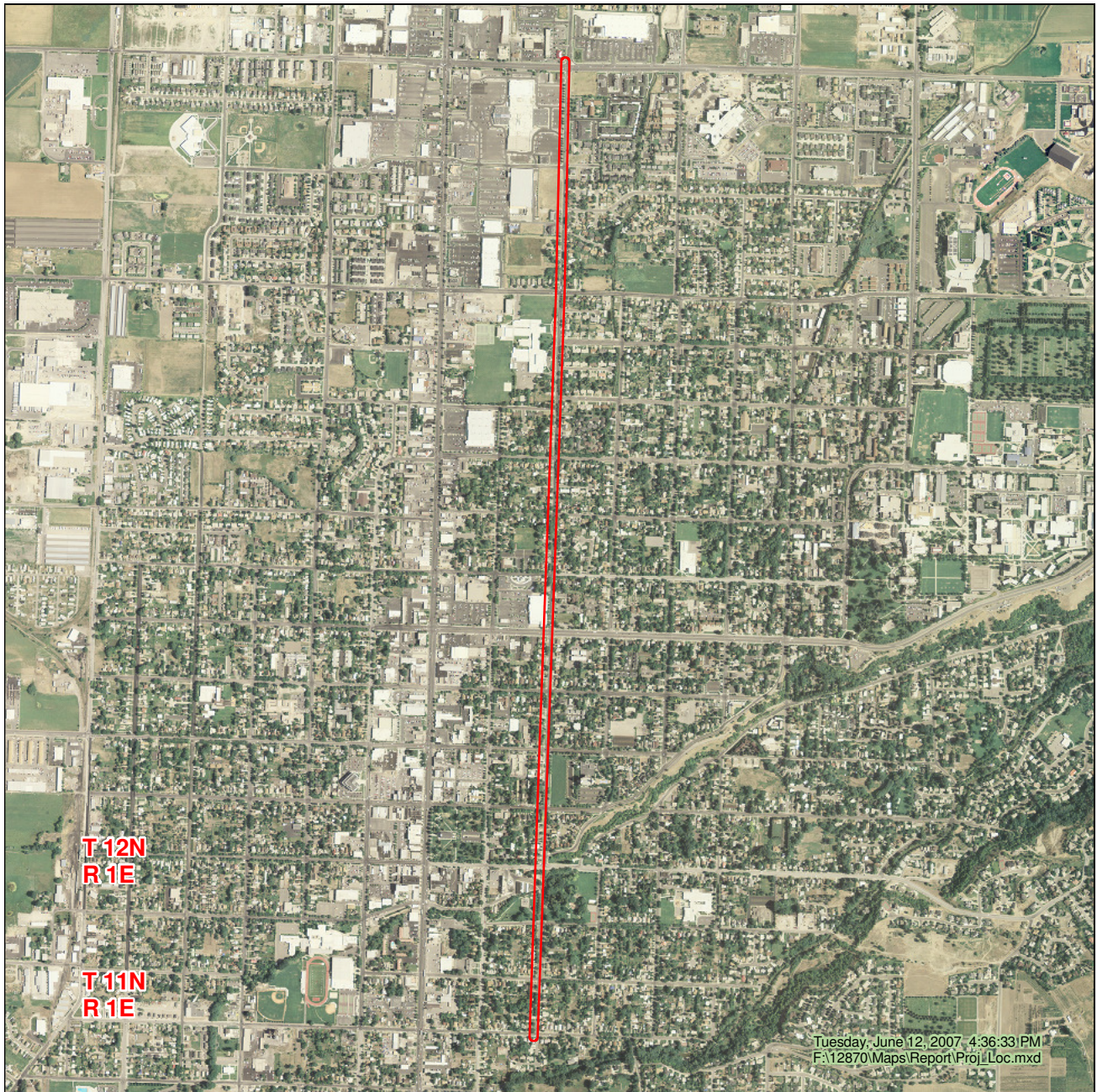
